1 POINTS AND AUTHORITIES: 2 I. Under California Penal Code § 2625, a prisoner has an absolute right to be present at any court 3 proceeding brought under Family Code §§ 7800 et. seq., and Welfare & Institutions Code § 366.26 which 4 may terminate the prisoner's parental rights, or any proceeding under Welfare and Institutions Code § 300, 5 where the prisoner's child may be adjudicated a dependent of the court. In any other action in which a 6 prisoner's parental or marital rights are subject to adjudication, the court may order that the prisoner be 7 brought before the court. 8 II. The California Supreme Court has held that an indigent prisoner seeking to defend a civil suit has a 9 due process right of access to the courts. (Payne v. Superior Court (1976) 17 Cal.3d 908, 919). A trial 10 court must exercise its discretion to determine whether access is best provided through a personal 11 appearance by the prisoner, representation by counsel, or both. (*Payne*, supra, 17 Cal.3d at pp. 924-25.) 12 Because incarceration creates unusual obstacles to effective communication between attorney and client 13 even when counsel has been appointed, a personal appearance by the prisoner is often essential to 14 safeguard the prisoner's marital and parental interests in actions which will affect those interests. 15 III.
